# Israel and End-Time Prophecies – Part III Israel: God's Time Clock

In all history only one sovereign nation, crushed with consummate cruelty, lost its national homeland and suffered its surviving population being forcibly scattered across the world for two millennia; yet endured and returned to reestablish a fully functioning sovereign national identity. This miracle entity can only be tiny Israel. Israel's rebirth not only had promising portentions for Jewish expatriates but also for Bible-believing scholars.

In the midst of answering His disciples' question, "What shall be the sign of thy coming, and the end of the world? (Matt. 24:3) Jesus, having already prophesied the desecration and destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem, further taught them, "Now learn a parable of the fig tree [a national symbol in Israel] when his branch is yet tender ... ye know that summer is nigh ... it is near, even at the doors.... This generation shall not pass ... till all be fulfilled (Matt. 24:32-34).

Jesus warned that from then until the end of the age, the descendants of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob would suffer greatly and Jerusalem would be "trodden down of the Gentiles" until the "times of the Gentiles be fulfilled" (Luke 21:24) and the "time of Jacob's trouble" begins (Jer. 30:7).

The "times of the Gentiles" actually began (political sovereignty lost to gentile overlords) when Nebuchadnezzar captured Jerusalem and took Judah captive (the southern tribes of Judah and Benjamin) ending Israel's sovereignty and self-governance. Full independence only resumed for Israel as a self-governing nation in 1948, although not in all the land promised by God to Abraham.

Many Old Testament prophecies point to the great world-spanning dispersion of Israel but also to their miraculous regathering and return to the land promised to Abraham in perpetuity (Gen. 15:18, 17:8). Israel had endured three dispersions and two regatherings with a third regathering still underway in our time. The first was from Canaan into Egypt where Israel was afflicted 400 years (Gen. 15:13-16). The second was into Babylon where their captivity lasted 70 years (Jer. 25:8-12) but only a remnant returned home. The third banishment resulted when Israel's leadership reviled, rejected and by devilish inducements impelled the Romans to fulfill the prophecies regarding the crucifixion of the Lord's Christ (Ps. 22; Is. 53; Dan. 9:24-27; Zech. 12:9-10; Acts 2:22-24, 36). The Lord Jesus Christ foretold the destruction of the Temple and of Jerusalem that preceded the world-wide banishment of the Jews from the Promised Land by rapacious Roman invaders.

The Jews survived as a distinct people simply because God promised that they would. Moses recorded, "...the Lord thy God hath chosen thee to be a special people unto himself, above all people" (Deut. 7:6). Some ask, however, "Has God not finished with Israel because of her rejection of the Messiah and replaced her with Christ's Church?"

Under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, the Apostle Paul answered this very question, "Hast God cast away his people"? God forbid.... God hath <u>NOT</u> cast away his people which

he foreknew ... even so then at this present time also there is a remnant according to the election of grace (Rom. 11:1-5) and the rest were blinded (vs. 7-8) ... because of unbelief they were broken off ... (vs. 20) ... blindness is happened in part to Israel <u>UNTIL</u> the fullness of the Gentiles be come in, and so all Israel shall be saved: as it is written, there shall come out of Sion the Deliverer, and shall turn away ungodliness from Jacob ... they are beloved for the father's sakes ... (vs. 25-28).

In a day yet future, Israel will be seen in mourning for that one "whom they have pierced" (Zech. 12:10, 13:6-9). While individual Jews have been and are still being saved, a future time will witness God's grace poured out on Jerusalem (Zech. 12:9-10) resulting in a glorious revival amongst God's chosen people.

The day is coming when national Israel will return to Jehovah (the Old Testament name of the one salvific Messiah) and become finally a "holy nation" and a "kingdom of priests." "The National Prodigal" returns to the Father (Jer. 31:7-11; Luke 15:11-32). God <u>will fulfill</u> His promise to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob (and to us all – Rom. 4:16) of everlasting safety (Ez. 34:11-13, 23-26) for Israel is the "apple of His eye."

The Apostle Paul wrote, "We have before proved both Jews and Gentiles ... are <u>ALL</u> under sin ..." (Rom 3:9). The unsaved Jews, like Gentiles are "...without God in the world" (Rom. 3:9-12; Ep. 2:2-3) yet Israel remains God's chosen and privileged nation.

Though Israel was overrun by armies and its people deported to foreign lands (Assyria, Babylon) Moses had prophesied a far wider scattering among, "<u>ALL PEOPLE FROM ONE END OF THE EARTH UNTO THE OTHER</u> ..." (Deut. 28:63-66). This only occurred when the leaders of Israel rejected their Messiah. This scatted them for nearly 2,000 years. Other Prophets so warned (Jer. 9:11-16; Hos. 9:17).

The "Times of the Gentiles" (Luke 21:24) was first prophesied in Daniel (chapter 2). God enlightened Daniel to interpret Nebuchadnezzar's dream of a massive image with a head of gold, breast and arms of silver, belly and thighs of brass, legs of iron, and feet part iron and part clay (vs. 31-33).

Nebuchadnezzar's vision then portrayed, "... that a <u>Stone</u> was cut out without hands [thus supernatural] which smote the image upon his feet ... and brake them ... like chaff ... the wind carried them" (vs. 34-35). Daniel's God ... "revealeth secrets" of "what shall be in the <u>LATTER DAYS</u>" (vs. 27-28). History revealed the head of Gold (Babylon) fell to the Medes and Persians (Silver) who in turn fell to Alexander the Great (Brass) whose Empire then crumbled before the Roman Legions (legs of Iron). The feet of iron and clay has been interpreted as a future reviving of the old Roman Empire. Some believe this is the now forming, "New World Order;" the "scarlet colored beast with seven heads and ten horns" of Revelation, chapter 17, verse 3. The seven heads are "seven mountains." <u>Rome</u> is the city of "seven hills" (vs. 9).

A Gentile kingdom will again exercise power over Jerusalem in the "<u>latter days</u>" and will again rule without a righteous acknowledgement of the only true and living God. At the closing of the "times of the Gentiles" comes the "Stone cut out, without hands" that at last destroys the evil power represented by the multi-metaled image. The Stone is the "King of

Kings" who destroys the armies of the Anti-Christ at the battle of Armageddon (Rev. 16:16-19).

Our Lord cautioned, "Behold I come as a thief" (unannounced) and "Blessed is he that watcheth" so let no teacher tell us that Christ told His disciples His return is "none of your business." The Babylonish spirit of those Gentile kingdoms will receive the fullness of God's wrath at Armageddon. Christ the Creator (John 1:1-3; Heb. 1:2) will end forever the satanic governance of the evil "prince of the power of the air," that "ruler of this present world" (John 12:31, 14:30, 16:11; 2 Cor. 4:4; Ep. 2:2).

Daniel received the vision of "the ancient of days" who assumes mastery over the kingdoms of this present world (Dan. 7:9, 14) and His dominion will be everlasting (Dan. 2:44, 7:14; Luke 1:33; 2 Pet. 1:11; Rev. 11:15).

History records that the Roman Empire decayed rather than being destroyed in one fell swoop, but it is to revive, regaining World dominating power. The scriptures record that Christ will vanquish all His enemies including the Arch-fiend Satan once Daniel's prophecies become "today's news."

God chose not to give any of His prophets the full details of the exact period of years from Christ's first advent on earth until He walks again on the Mount of Olives (Acts 1:9-11; Zech. 14:1-4, 9). The Lord Jesus Christ expanded and enlarged the prophecies of the Old Testament that referenced His return to earth but likewise elected not to reveal the exact length of years between His first and second advents. He did point to signs of which to be aware (Luke 21).

As of our day, we have seen partial fulfillment of prophecies regarding God's chosen nation and their appointed return to the Promised Land (1948 and on). We see the very extensive preparations, including the stockpiling of building materials for the erection of the Third Temple, yet national blindness remains upon the hearts of God's people. This will be miraculously removed when Christ returns (Jer. 24:6-7) and reestablishes David's throne (Is. 9:7; Jer. 23:5; John 1:49; 1 Tim. 6:15; Rev. 17:14, 19:16). Keep looking up (Luke 21:28).
